

# Review Processes

The outcome of a Rapid Review will lead to one of two processes.

1. **Initiate the LCSPR process.** The Rapid Review Panel have agreed further information and analysis is needed, potentially leading to additional learning. This is a statutory process which needs to be completed within 6 months. The final report will be sent to the National Panel and published on the SSCP website.
2. **Learning Dissemination.** The Rapid Review process has identified all relevant learning which will be shared. This will be disseminated across the partnership via a variety of formats as appropriate, such as 7 minute briefings.

## Full LCSPR process

An LCSPR has been recommended as CRG have identified there will be new learning not yet available or it tackles a perennial problem needing further attention

An LCSPR Panel is formed and 3-4 key lines of enquiry are agreed.

An Independent Lead Reviewer is commissioned to review the case and write a report which will be submitted to the National Panel within 6 months. This will identify learnings and recommendations

All involved agencies will be asked to complete an **Information Management Report (IMR)** and **Chronology** to analyse the agency's involvement with the child and family and identify any themes that have emerged.

Panel meetings – members of CRP will attend 3-4 meetings and a reflective practitioner discussion (if approp.)

Learnings are progressed by the Learning from Practice sub-group via an action plan and the **Final Report** is published on the SSCP website

## Learning Dissemination

CRG is satisfied that all learning has been identified during the Rapid Review process and this can now be shared.

Information for learning will be gathered from the Initial Scoping and Information sharing document, previously submitted by agencies as part of the Rapid Review and the Rapid Review outcome report. IMRs or chronologies will not be required.

Learning will be shared via a 7-minute briefing and themed learning events such as reflective practitioner discussions
