The Learning from the Thematic Review and Suicide Prevention Toolbox was presented at dedicated webinars (Awareness of Autistic Spectrum Disorder (ASD); Management of selfharm; Prevention of alcohol and substance misuse; Parent support; Work across the County to mitigate Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs); Timely support for children and young people in crisis, Support for completing effective referrals; Implementing a Surrey Healthy Schools Approach)



August 2019

Terms of Reference agreed for the panel for the Thematic Review of probable suicide by children and young people in Surrey 2014 -2020

April 2020

The final review and an infographic was published on the SSCP website for dissemination to professionals.

An online lunch and learn session with over 100 attendees was held to present the results of the thematic review as part of the Child Death Review partnership learning programme.

The Child Death Review team facilitated four virtual webinars in October 2020 to support the dissemination of lessons identified in the thematic review, with over 200 attendees, which was accredited for CPD by the Faculty of Public Health.

December

2020

Positive feedback on the thematic reviews was also highlighted in the Peer Review Report of Surrey Safeguarding Children Partnership completed by Our Safeguarding Children Partnership for Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly in December 2020 :"The quality of both of these reports was high, with clear analysis and identification of areas of learning....... This was an effective route to collate the learning from a number of cases and share that learning across the partnership"

Increased multi-agency, co-ordinated response to a suspected suicide in Surrey with initiation of Information Sharing and Planning Meeting as part of formalised plan of action, including for those who are near death or anticipated to die whilst in Intensive Care

January 2021

A multi-agency task and finish group was initiated to develop an action plan based on the opportunities not to be missed identified in the thematic review.



March 2021

Feedback received in March 2021 from the Section 11 self-assessment audit reported that "the range of evidence provided to demonstrate that your organisation actively promotes multi-agency work to improve outcomes and keep children safe, e.g. the thematic case reviews and the thematic review of adolescent suicides"

September 2021

A Children and Young People's sub-group of the Surrey Suicide Prevention Strategy was formed to take forward the monitoring of the action plan developed by the Task and Finish Group. Thematic review is referenced in Surrey Healthy Schools online self evaluation toolkit and used to support development of a whole school approach to improving wellbeing in pupils.

October 2021

National Child Mortality Database publish their report on adolescent suicide.

An 18 month update report was published Surrey-Thematic-Review-of-Probable-Adolescent-Suicides-18-month-updatereport.pdf (surreyscp.org.uk) and the deaths are also mapped against the themes identifed from the national report.



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November 2021

A new out-of-hours phone line providing advice to parents and carers who are struggling with behaviours or difficulties which could be related to neurodevelopmental need, such as autism or ADHD is launched as a result of identified need from the thematic review. It runs from 5pm until

11pm, seven days a week, 365 days a year.



February 2022

Following succesful funding bid to WER (Wellbeing for Education Return), launch of start of online learning sessions across the year for free training for Surrey schools, services, partners and the third sector into a Whole School Approach to Building a Thriving School Culture.

January 2022

Lunch and learn sessions launched on 'Responding to the sudden and unexpected death of a pupil in your school.'

Thematic review is used as an example of good practice in the evidence presented at inquest.




Following a succesful funding bid to the Surrey Safeguarding Children's Partnership, 'Responding to the Sudden and Unexpected Death of a Pupil in your school' learning day took place at Sandown Racecourse. 82 delegates attended the one-day event representing 63 settings, 6 of which were from the independent sector. As part of the survey school were offered the a free Lions Life pack, further details can be found: Lions Life Packs Primary Lions Life Packs Secondary . 100% of schools that completed the survey requested a pack.

July 2022

Lunch and Learn run on the Suicide thematic review update – 2 years on to update professionals in Surrey on the work that has taken place.





September 2022

PAPYRUS Community Development Officer role starts, funded by Surrey County Council Public Health Team to update the Suicide Prevention Toolkit and provide training and support to schools on suicide prevention.

November 2022

January 2023


Two lunch and learn sessions are run by Papyrus as part of the Child Death Review learning programme,



Engagement on the Children and Young People's Emotional Wellbeing and Mental Health Strategy. 6 key themes identified: self-help, accessible signposting, timeliness of support, online safety and social media use, parent and carer support, and supporting the workforce.



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August

2023

Padlet of emotional wellbeing and mental health resources for universities created and shared via the Public Health Universities Network.



Guidance developed for schools around sharing concerns related to social cognition and emerging risks. Online form developed and piloted. Guidance and form shared at Surrey Designated Safeguarding Leads meeting.

November 2023

Workshop delivered to Suicide Prevention Partners outlining how to use Alison Todd Suicide Prevention Protocol, slides shared with children and young people suicide prevention partners including Mindworks.



Papyrus trained 641 professionals working with Children and Young People in Surrey in total.

Lucy Rayner Foundation delivered 25 Mental Health First Aid courses reaching 169 professionals, and 4 Young people Mental Health First Aid Champions courses for 4 target schools.

Living Works delivered 4 ASIST workshops reaching 80 professionals across Surrey
