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The Child Safeguarding Practice Review Panel

On 26th May 2022, the Panel published its latest national review, which looked at the tragically short lives of Arthur Labinjo-Hughes and Star Hobson.

The review was the first of its kind and aimed to understand what happened to Arthur and Star. It considered how agencies acted to safeguard both children, and what factors enabled or limited their ability to protect them, in order to identify improvements for the future.

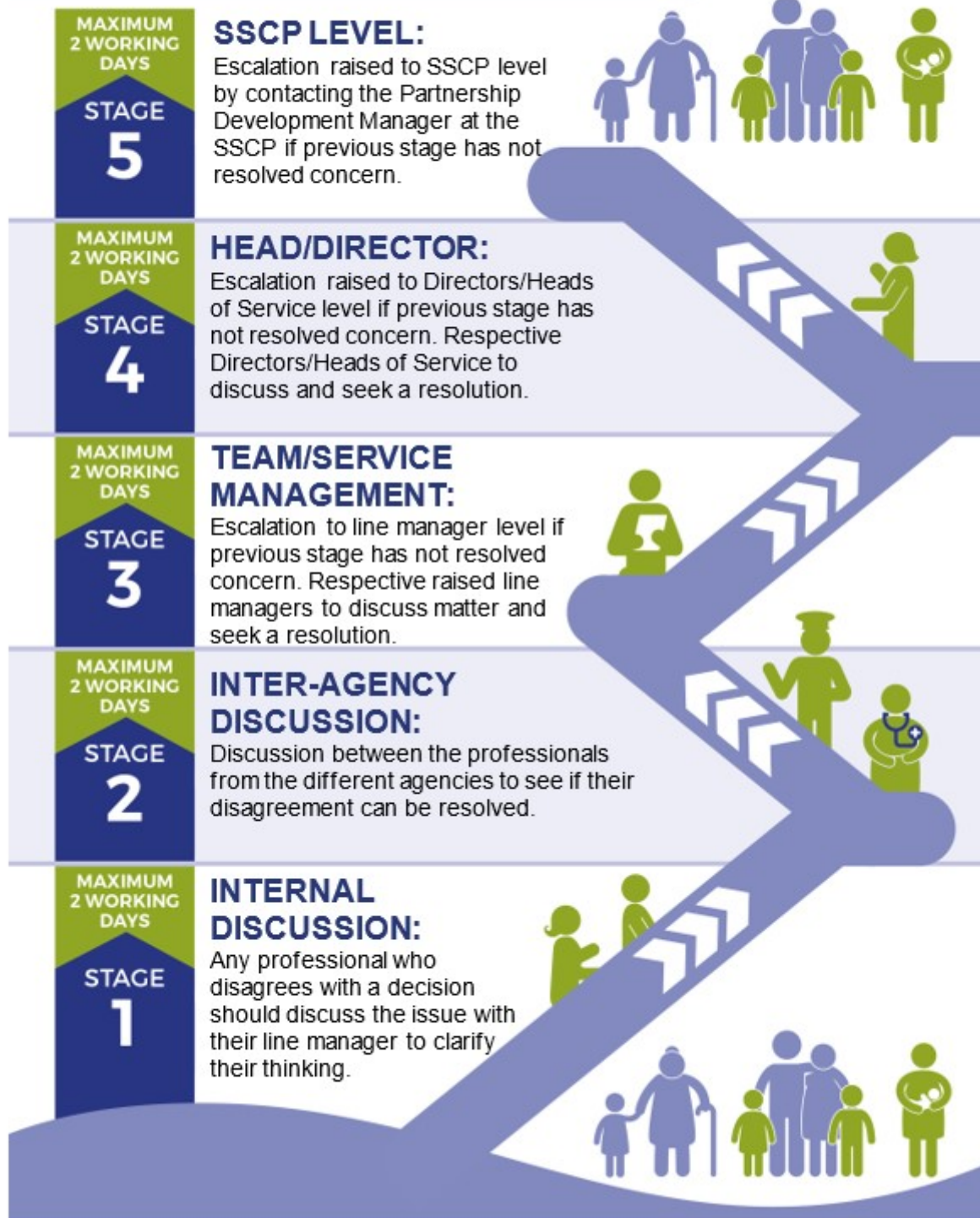

Finding a Solution Together - the FaST process

What is the new *FaST* Resolution Process?

Following an evaluation of the existing escalation process in 2021, the SSCP has revised and refocused the process to address some of the issues and barriers that were preventing partners from using it. One of the changes has been to remove the term “escalation” and to focus more on the timeliness and collaborative approach for resolving issues. FaST stands for Finding a Solution Together and the new approach has been fully agreed with all our partners.

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Neglect Matters

We continue to focus on Neglect and to support our practice around Neglect in Surrey. To do this we need **Practice Leads** who can support and encourage others in their team to use the tool.

GCP2 Practice Leads requirements:

- Be positive advocates for the use of GCP2.
- Have used GCP2 at least once and be regularly using GCP2.
- Demonstrate good GCP2 practice and understanding.
- Promote the principles of the use of GCP2 within their teams.
- Support colleagues within their team/s to use GCP2 through general advice and mentoring.
- Support colleagues within their teams to use ECINS.

Surrey and Sussex Police will be changing the way it shares Operation Encompass notifications with education establishments. In order to comply with governance around the sharing of personal data, notifications will be sent via an encrypted zip file which will require a unique password to open.

For each notification two emails will be generated, one containing the encrypted file and the other a unique password to unprotect the document.
